THE AWARDING OF PRIZES

Subject Prizes

There are subject prize winners in Years 7, 8, 9, 10 and 12 for each curriculum area. Students are nominated by each department, and both effort and outcome are considered.

GCSE & GNVQ

The Year 11 prize winners are those students who averaged a score of 750 or above from all their GCSEs and GNVQs taken at the College. The points allocated are A*-58, A-52, B-46, C-40 and so on.

A-level

The Year 13 A-level prize winners are those students who scored 340 points or above from their best three advanced level performances. The points allocated are: A-120, B-100, C-80 and so on.

Brooke Weston Special Awards

The Neil O'Shea Sport Person of the Year

Neil's parents felt that the finest memorial tribute was to award a prize for the best Sports Person of the Year. The students at Brooke Weston College raised a substantial sum of money to be invested in an annual prize.

Tyrone Clipstone - embarked on his GCSE in 3-Dimensional studies during Year 11. He quickly took to the subject and worked diligently on each project. His dedication and commitment has been evident throughout and his efforts and skill were rewarded with a grade A. It was therefore decided to award a prize to a student who has achieved remarkable success in spite of particular challenges in art and design technology.
