Classics refers to the study of the languages, literatures, material culture, and history of the societies of the ancient world of Greece and Rome together with their influence on later periods and cultures right up to the present day. If you're interested in the study of Ancient Greek, Latin, history, archaeology, mythology and society, then this is the elective for you.

The Combined Cadet Force (CCF) is a youth organisation in the United Kingdom, sponsored by the Ministry of Defence (MOD), which operates in schools, and normally includes Army, Royal Navy and Royal Air Force sections. If you enjoy being outside, working as part of a team and want to build your confidence, this is the elective for you. Enrolling on this elective does not mean that you are enlisting into the army.

Enjoy a challenge? Want to get fit? This is an eightweek course to build up to running $5 k$. There will be a variety of fun events and challenges, both on and off-site. This will build up to be able to complete a 5 k run which is the same as a Parkrun distance. This elective is for anybody that wants to have fun and build their fitness through challenging themselves.

Do you enjoy discussing your views and opinions on real world issues? Do you feel your words empower you? Would you like to build confidence in presenting and group discussion within a respectful and safe space? Topics will be presented that impact our everyday lives e.g. climate issues, equal rights etc.

Discussion will be centered around your point of views and the views of others. You will conduct research and challenge others in a formal debating setting building debating champions. Everyone can get involved, regardless of your confidence levels in public speaking. A debating team needs good researchers, quick thinkers, team collaboration in addition to confidence in delivery and articulation.

Take part in a nationally recognised award which is gained through participants learning new skills, committing to weekly physical activity and volunteering roles; ending with an expedition with your teammates.

If you are interested in horses, this is the elective for you. We will support and enhance your knowledge of horse care. Looking at the different aspects of feeding, cost, expectations, common ailments, types of competition and history of horse care. You will understand how to care for a horse, learn a dressage test, and discover possible careers plus more.

DESCRIPTION

Enjoy reading or want to improve your reading skills as a group? Want to read and explore new genres? Want to read for pleasure and creatively respond to what you read? This is the elective for you? We will be reading a selection of different fictional genres as a group, including Harry Potter, and then carrying out activities relating to the things we read.

Sociolinguistics is the study of language all around us.
