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Lesson PSHE

Students will study budgeting and finances and challenges caused by poor financial decisions. Pupils will also study British values and the role of citizens in a democracy

Tutor time PSHE

Pupils will also consider equality in the modern world and stereotypes.

Lesson PSHE

Pupils will build on their prior study of parliament in Year 7 and look at the role of political parties and how they work for us in the UK. This will look at the concept of democracy building on the prior learning in Year 7.
