“Attendance Matters!”

Why attendance matters?



- Students whose attendance remains between 97% and 100% are in the **best position to achieve the top grades** in their GCSEs and A-Levels.
- Students with **100% attendance have almost 75% chance of gaining 5 or more GCSEs** at grades 5-9
- Students whose attendance drops below 94% will have missed 2 weeks of school. This has a significant impact on GCSE results
- Students with a rate of attendance **lower than 95%, have lower than 50% chance of gaining 5 or more GCSEs** at grades 5-9

School Responsibilities



- Maintain high expectations of student attendance
- Develop and maintain a whole school culture that promotes the benefits of good attendance
- Accurately complete admission and attendance registers
- Have robust daily processes to follow up absence
- Have a dedicated senior leader with overall responsibility for attendance (Mrs Jeyes)
- Proactively use data to identify those at risk of, low attendance and develop strategies to support them
- Refer cases of persistent absence to the Local authority

Working Together



- The school will work with parents to remove any barriers to attendance this could include:
 - Meetings with students
 - Letters warning parents if students are at risk
 - Attendance support meetings
 - Parenting contracts
 - Referral to the local authority
- Where this intervention is unsuccessful and there are out of school barriers, the local authority and school will implement a multi agency approach to tackling poor attendance to provide each student and their family with access to services they need
- Where support is not being engaged with or is not working, and it is appropriate [legal intervention will be implemented by the local authority](#)

Parental Responsibilities

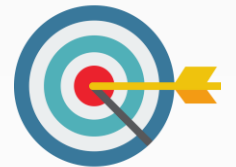


- Ensure our child comes into school everyday on time and ready to learn

- Providing medical evidence for unavoidable medical or dental appointments
- If your child is having difficulties attending school, contact your child's form tutor or Student Care Team as soon as possible
- Attend all meetings with regards to your child's attendance
- Not taking holidays in term time

Student Responsibilities



- Attend school every day on time and be punctual to lessons
- Only miss school for serious illness and not colds, coughs, sneezes or headaches
- Not to expect to be sent home from school unless you have a serious illness where parents will need to collect you
- Understand that lateness can effect attendance
- Be on time to school and lessons
- Know that your personal attendance target is 97%



All students have an attendance target of 97%
