Dear Parents/Carers,

Following the Government's announcement we wanted to update you on our arrangements for remote education and examinations <u>National lockdown: Stay at Home - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u>.

As the situation currently stands:

- All students will now receive remote education from 5th January 2021 until further notice
- Critical worker parents wishing to send their child into school need to complete the **critical worker form each week.** This will be sent out by text/email each week and parents will be contacted to arrange attendance.
- Parents of vulnerable students have been contacted to arrange their child's return to school.

The DfE definition of vulnerable children is given in <u>this guidance</u> and it is optional for the children of critical workers to return with the definition of critical workers given <u>here</u>.

It is important to note that all teaching for all students off site will be on Teams and this will be a mixture of live and recorded lessons. Please note that there will be no PE lessons as part of the students' timetables, instead this period will act as a break within the students' day.

Critical and vulnerable students

- Students need to be onsite between 8:15am 8:35am and enter the via the school's main reception.
- Students will work within a computer room for tutor time and for periods 1-5.
- There is no specialist teaching within lessons, students will be supervised while engaging in online learning.
- Students will therefore also require headphones in order to engage with live lessons via Teams.
- Students need to be in full school uniform and breakfast/lunch arrangements will be as normal.
- Students will leave site at **3:35pm** in a staggered way per group bubble.

Transport and bus service

Due to the announcement that we are now in national lockdown, and reduced number of students requiring the bus service, we will now unfortunately **need to significantly reduce this service**. Therefore, **from the 11th January 2021** only two buses will run with reduced pick up points.

Parents/carers will need to either get their child/children to one of these stops, or move to parent drop off and pick up. It is unfortunate that we are having to make this decision, but the bus service cannot currently continue to run to the same capacity in this national lockdown. Critical and vulnerable student parents and carers will be contacted with more details this week along with a letter detailing the stops and times.

Remote Education

Information sent out previously regarding remote education will continue, but we will of course continue to review this provision. Along with this parental contact based on lesson attendance and work completed will restart with various communication methods used to share this information with parents. This may include emails from teachers, calls from the curriculum team, and/or a weekly report card on work completed. Details of this can be found as an annex to this letter.

Mock Examinations

Mock examinations will no longer take place during January, they will be rescheduled for when students return. Therefore reports and parents' evening dates will need to be moved later. As soon as this has been finalised, and based on any further information released by the DfE, we will communicate the new dates with parents.

External Examinations

Following last night's update that schools will decide individually if they are able to run external examinations during January, at Brooke Weston Academy, we have made the decision that **January external examinations** for all students will **continue as planned from the 11th January 2021**.

Our exam arrangements follow all of the contingency guidance for conducting public examinations at this time, and will be completed in well ventilated spaces with desks 2m spaced. All invigilators will wear PPE when handing out or collecting papers/equipment from students, and students are also welcome to wear face coverings during their examination. Hand sanitiser will be at all entrances, and students will be required to wear their face covering on arrival and when leaving the site.

All students will receive another copy of their exam timetable to their school email tomorrow.

Students in Years 10, 11, 12 and 13 should only attend school during weeks 2, 3 and 4 if they have an **external examination**. They will need to arrive 15 minutes before the start time, 9:00 am for morning exams or 1:15 pm for afternoon exams, and should be collected following their examination. We have started contacting students involved in external examinations today to confirm arrangements and will continue tomorrow.

Our first day of TEAMs teaching during this national lockdown has gone really well and we want to thank all students for their engagement.

As a reminder the times for the school day are as follows and students will be expected to attend lessons during these times. Break and lunch needs to be taken during period 1 and period 3 and is 15 minutes for break and 30 minutes for lunch. KS4/5 teachers will communicate break and lunch times during the live lesson with the students.

Along with the remote curriculum, students need to continue to engage in weekly assemblies and a weekly tutor time. This will also allow us to further support students remotely. Attendance to the weekly tutor times is compulsory and more detail around these can be found below.
